Zoetica Ebb is a London-based multimedia artist whose award-winning Alien Botany™ series explores the human capacity for adaptation through the eyes of a lifelong immigrant. In her work, she challenges ideas of what is natural and looks to the potential of our genetic alphabet in an imagined future among the stars.

Ebb's art book, *Chimeric Herbarium*, contains the complete Alien Botany art archive and a record of the new forms these plants have taken in the years since this infectious collection was discovered on Earth.

CHIMERIC HERBARIUM: THE WORLD OF ALIEN BOTANY

2174 AD. Five years ago, a shipwrecked cosmonaut from the exploratory mission, Novy Mir, documented the flora of an unknown planet in quadrant NQ3 while waiting for a rescue team. Her notes and sketches were found inside a charred capsule adrift in the Arctic Ocean. The scientific community, awed by what she discovered, has been attempting to decode her diagrams ever since. The cosmonaut's archive takes on many forms; it appears she used whatever materials had survived the crash. As reconstruction continues in laboratories worldwide, we are pleased to present a handful of her findings here.

Would you allow a strange organism to merge with your DNA if it meant survival in a harsh alien environment? How much of your "self" do you need to still be you, and, ultimately, does it matter? These are the questions facing a shipwrecked cosmonaut documenting the ecosystem of her new reality in Zoetica Ebb's concept series, Alien Botany™. These works on paper employ a vocabulary of techniques drawn from enlightenment-age naturalist studies and Victorian medical illustration.

Chimeric Herbarium, a found object from the future penned by Ebb, presents her cosmonaut protagonist's findings in large-format plates of detailed, stark black-and-red ink diagrams alongside uncanny descriptions of the mystery flora and the ways it interacts with human hosts – presumably other crew members of the ill-fated space mission. A sumptuous foil-stamped black tome with a field-durable five-part cover, Chimeric Herbarium collects the Alien Botany art archive together with other forms the plants have taken on since entering gross terrestrial reality. With a foreword by Ryan Oakley, co-curator of The Museum of a Billion Cosmic Objects and author of Technicolor Ultra Mall, Chimeric Herbarium illuminates the cryptic world of Alien Botany.
